**Chancellor Brice W. Harris' Statement on the University of California's
Transfer Plan for California Community Colleges Students**

SACRAMENTO, Calif. – California Community Colleges Chancellor Brice W. Harris responds to University of California's introduction of a new academic roadmap for California Community Colleges students who plan to apply to transfer to UC campuses, a step forward in an effort to simplify the admissions process and help students better prepare for transfer to the university.

"This initiative offers community college students a transparent roadmap for transfer to UC, as well as for timely completion of their bachelor's degree in their major of choice," said California Community Colleges Chancellor Brice W. Harris. "This adds to the work we have been doing with other four-year partners to streamline transfer and expand options for our talented students."
